

#### Discovery Bay Community Meeting: Issues and Vision

Discovery Bay Community Center 1601 Discovery Bay Boulevard, Discovery Bay, CA 94505 Wednesday, April 24<sup>th</sup>, 2019

A community meeting for Discovery Bay residents as part of Envision Contra Costa 2040 took place on Wednesday, April 24, 2019, from 6:00 to 8:00 PM at the Town of Discovery Bay Community Center. The purpose of this workshop was to begin establishing a vision for the future of Discovery Bay and identify issues the General Plan should address to achieve that vision. County staff and consultants facilitated the workshop and five residents attended and participated. After a presentation about the Envision Contra Costa 2040 process, since there was a limited number of attendees, a group discussion was held between community members and the project team to discuss questions regarding the future of this community. Responses to each question are summarized below. Detailed notes from the group discussion are attached to this summary. No written comment cards were submitted at the workshop.

#### Question 1: What do you like most about Discovery Bay? What would you like to see supported, preserved, or enhanced as part of this planning effort?

- Maintain water access, boating, and other water recreation opportunities.
- Preserve the farmland surrounding the community, which acts as a buffer.
- Enhance connections to regional parks and open space.

### Question 2: What are the challenges facing Discovery Bay? What would you like to see changed in Discovery Bay Costa in order to make it a better place to live and work?

- Develop vacant and unmaintained properties.
- Improve emergency access and evacuation plans, including by adding another access road into the community.
- Concerns about inundation from dam and levee failures.
- Develop a high school in or near Discovery Bay.
- Improve safe routes to schools, including to Excelsior Middle School.
- Add a sports field complex, possibly on the east side of Discovery Bay.
- Provide bathrooms and better maintenance at Slifer Park and consider transitioning ownership to the Community Services District.
- Develop more commercial and office uses to provide local jobs.


#### Question 3: Do you think changes are needed to the planned land uses shown in the General Plan land use and zoning maps? If so, what changes are needed?

- Address the vacant lot of the once-proposed senior housing project within Lakeshore.
- Develop or rezone the underutilized commercial space.
- Adjust Urban Limit Line to accurately reflect protected natural areas.
- Rezone part of the large property east of Cherry Hills Drive for commercial/office space.




