

#### Pacheco, Vine Hill, and Mountain View Community Meeting: Issues and Vision

Pacheco Community Center 5800 Pacheco Boulevard, Pacheco, CA 94553 Wednesday, May 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019

A community meeting for Pacheco, Vine Hill, and Mountain View residents as part of Envision Contra Costa 2040 took place on Wednesday, May 8th, 2019, from 6:30 to 8:30 PM at the Pacheco Community Center. The purpose of this workshop was to begin establishing a vision for the future of these communities and identify issues the General Plan should address to achieve that vision. County staff and consultants facilitated the workshop and 16 residents attended and participated. After a presentation about the Envision Contra Costa 2040 process, community members worked in three small groups discussing questions regarding the future of these communities. Responses to each question are summarized below. Detailed notes from the small group discussions are attached to this summary.

### Question 1: What do you like most about Pacheco, Vine Hill, and Mountain View? What would you like to see supported, preserved, or enhanced as part of this planning effort?


- Preserve the friendly, neighborly atmosphere throughout the three communities.
- Preserve wildlife habitat, open spaces, and connections to nature, such as along Grayson Creek.
- Support good schools and the Pacheco Community Center.
- Respect and preserve historic buildings in Pacheco.
- Preserve the flexible, independent culture of the unincorporated area that separates it from surrounding cities.
- Support ongoing aviation at Buchanan Field.

### Question 2: What are the challenges facing Pacheco, Vine Hill, and Mountain View? What would you like to see changed in Pacheco, Vine Hill, and Mountain View in order to make them better places to live and work?

- Improve public transit options and accessibility, add bicycle lanes, and promote alternative transportation modes.
- Improve pedestrian infrastructure, especially on school routes.
- Reduce traffic congestion on the freeways and improve road maintenance.
- Support the homeless population with housing and services.
- Improve public safety and reduce property crime, in part by increasing coordination across adjacent jurisdictions.
- Clean up illegal dumping.
- Address stormwater drainage issues.
- Construct a sound barrier along the new Highway 4 and Interstate 680 interchange.
- Coordinate with Buchanan Field Airport to limit flight patterns over residential areas.
- Encourage economic investment along major thoroughfares with attractive commercial uses.

### Question 3: Do you think changes are needed to the planned land uses shown in the General Plan land use and zoning maps? If so, what changes are needed?

- Create more connections between the Contra Costa Canal Trail, Iron Horse Trail, and Benicia Bridge.
- Create more connections to Pacheco Creekside Park.
- Designate more official parkland.
- Promote the creation of affordable housing, especially for students and teachers, with accessory dwelling units (ADUs), mobile home parks, and other housing alternatives.
- Rezone residential areas to allow for multi-family units without impacting parking availability.
- Consider the potential revenue generated by zoning for commercial cannabis activities.


