### **Clyde Virtual Community Meeting: Draft Community Profile**

Thursday, August 13, 2020

A virtual community meeting for Clyde residents as part of Envision Contra Costa 2040 took place on Thursday, August 13, 2020, from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM on [Zoom.us](https://zoom.us). The purpose of this workshop was to collect feedback on the draft community profile for Clyde, as well as potential changes to the General Plan land use map. The first part of the draft profile provides context about the community, including its character, demographic information, and exposure to hazards that may impact the community. The second section includes an overview of planned land uses, guiding principles, policies, and actions that will provide guidance to the County when making decisions affecting the community related to growth and development over the next twenty years.

County staff and consultants facilitated a small virtual workshop, with four residents that attended and participated. The community members reviewed the draft community profile with County staff and consultants. Input and ideas are summarized below. Detailed notes from the discussion are attached to this summary.

- Investigate whether the path built over the railroad right-of-way poses soil contaminant threats.
- Add or expand policies to address the need for better communication networks between emergency services and residents.
- Consider reorganizing the policies to reflect the community's priorities related to the health and wellbeing of Clyde residents.
- Reword Policy #4 to express support for tree planting, acknowledging that some residents have concerns about view preservation.
- Expand Action #4 to include a bikeway along Port Chicago Highway to connect Clyde to the countywide bicycle network and regional trails such as the Iron Horse Trail.
- Consider adding actions to encourage tree planting, beautification projects, and establishing a bicycle/pedestrian path along the Contra Costa Canal that connects Clyde with the future Concord Hills Regional Park.
