Environmental Impact Report

What is the General Plan?

- » Guides development and conservation in the unincorporated County

What is the Climate Action Plan (CAP)?

- » Sets greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reduction targets for the unincorporated county

What is the Zoning Code?

- » Regulations that control physical development on an individual site




Senate Bill 1000

What is Environmental Justice?

The fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE §65040.12(E)




Senate Bill 1000

- » In impacted communities:
 - Reduce pollution exposure and improve air quality
 - Promote public facilities
 - Promote food access
 - Promote safe and sanitary homes
 - Promote physical activity
- » Engage the community in decision-making
- » Prioritize improvements and programs that address needs in disadvantaged communities


