

Why Update the General Plan Now?

- » Existing General Plan is 30 years old and doesn't address many of the challenges communities currently face
- » AB 32 Global Warming Solutions Act
- » SB 375 Sustainable Communities Strategy/Plan Bay Area
- » SB 743 Vehicle Miles Traveled
- » AB 379 Climate Change Adaptation and Resilience
- » SB 1000 Environmental Justice
- » New legislation related to housing
- » Consistency with other plans and initiatives (Local Hazard Mitigation Plan, Adapting to Rising Tides, Land Use and Resource Management Plan for the Delta)

Components of the General Plan

- » Required Elements
 - Land Use
 - Transportation
 - Safety
 - Noise
 - Open Space
 - Conservation
 - Housing

- » Optional Elements in Current General Plan
 - Growth Management
 - Public Facilities/Services



Four Themes Throughout the New Plan

» Economic development



» Sustainability



» Environmental justice



» Community health



Draft Goal, Policy, and Action

» Conservation Element - Creeks, Wetlands, and Riparian Areas

- <u>*Draft Goal:</u> Protected and restored natural watercourses, riparian corridors, and wetland areas that improve habitat, water quality, wildlife diversity, stormwater flows, and scenic values. (7-P, 8-D, 8-E, 8-V, 8-W, 8-3, 8-6, 8-17, 8-82, 8-83, 8-90, 8-98)
- <u>*Draft Policy:</u> Require that new development preserve natural watercourses and riparian habitat where they occur, either by avoidance or through ecologically-sensitive design, like clustering buildings, restoring riparian habitat, and purchasing development rights or easements within required setback areas. (8-91, 8-92, 8-cy)
- <u>*Draft Action:</u> Acquire deeded development rights to setback areas surrounding wetlands and natural watercourses to ensure preservation of the resource and protect adjacent improvements. (8-V, 8-96)

Environmental Impact Report (EIR)

- » California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires disclosure of a project's potential impacts on the physical environment
- » EIR must:
 - Disclose information about the effects the project could have on the physical environment
 - Identify mitigation measures, if necessary
 - Describe feasible alternatives to the proposed project

» Public review

- Initial 30-day scoping period tell us what to analyze
- Minimum 45-day review of Draft EIR comment on the analysis
